

Research fellowship on "Research methodologies for language and wellbeing" - Università Ca' Foscari Venezia (Italian law 30 December 2010, n. 240, art. 22)

Description

The Department of Asian and North African Studies at Università Ca' Foscari Venezia invites applications for a fellowship in:

Title: Research methodologies for language and wellbeing

Scientific sector: L-OR/22

Scientific supervisor and tutor: Prof. Patrick Heinrich

Duration: 12 months

Abstract:

The research fellowship activities will be part of the SPIN project "Language Endangerment and subjective wellbeing (LESWE)", which studies comparatively language and wellbeing in three endargered language communities in the Ryukyu Islands.

Indigenous languages are more important for their speakers and society than has been previously thought. Most countries have established monolingual language regimes to create a sense of unity among their linguistically diverse population. Japan is a prototypical example. The effect is that indigenous languages – in Japan Ainu and Ryukyuan – have become endangered. We understand today that monolingual language regimes are problematic. Pilot studies among Aborigines in Canada and Australia show that linguistic assimilation that leaves no place for indigenous languages coincide with higher-than average mental and physical problems (e.g. depression, obesity). These findings prompt the following research question: To what extent does the language people know and speak affect their mental and physical wellbeing? To answer this question, this project studies language and wellbeing comparatively in three endangered language communities, starting from three large-scale surveys in the Ryukyu Islands and among new speakers of Ryukyuan in Japan and in diaspora communities.

The research fellow will support the SPIN Principal Investigator, Prof. Patrick Heinrich, in the analysis of the large amount of data that will be collected via questionnaires. He/she will be responsible for:

- a) data cleaning and data input into the statistical software SPPS;
- b) basic data analysis (crossing variables) and statistical calculation (regression analysis);
- (c) assisting the PI identifying and collecting existing psychometric data on wellbeing from the three communities.

These skills can be acquired in the course of activities but Japanese language skills and knowledge about Japanese sociolinguistics are required. The research fellow will acquire important sociolinguistic research and analytical skills at the end of the research period.

Who can apply

Candidates are expected to hold at least a master's degree and to have a CV suitable for the requested research activities. They must be proficient in Japanese, English and Italian language.

The interview will focus on the following topics:

• Knowledge of language endangerment in Japan, especially in the Ryukyu Islands



- Notions of quantitative sociolinguistics
- Assessment of knowledge of Japanese language;

Ca' Foscari encourages applications from researchers who have received positive evaluation in all the criteria applicable to funding programs, such as Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar. Researchers having successfully completed Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions - Individual Fellowships/ERC Starting Grants/FIRB (Italian Fund for basic research investments)/SIR (Scientific Young Independence Research) or similar funded projects are warmly encouraged to apply.

Duration of contract: 12 months (approx. start: October, 01st, 2022).

Stipend: The research fellowship amounts to 19,367 Euros per year, including taxes and social charges.

Evaluation

Up to 100 points, specifically: For CV and publications, from 0 to 60; For interview, from 0 to 40.
