1. Select the paper version among:

T Y P O L O G Y	Pre-print document	It refers to the paper before the peer-review , thus possibly different in content from the edited version.
	Post-print document	It refers to the paper after the peer-review ; thus, the uploaded file is expected to be equal in contents to the published version, although it has a different layout and formatting. Most of the publishers consent to self-archive documents in institutional repositories like ARCA, often after a period of embargo.
	Publisher version	It is the final version of the article produced and printed by the publisher . For papers of Edizioni Ca' Foscari select always this option.
	Other material	File audio, video, photo ecc.

2. Select the paper access policy among:

A C C E S P O L I C Y	Open Access	The file will be available online ; the rights management will be specified at the next point <i>Distribution license</i> . For papers of Edizioni Ca' Foscari select always this option.
	Embargo	Period during which access to the full text is not allowed (but metadata are always available). At the end of this period, the publication will pass in <i>Open access</i> status . Max period of embargo: 12 months (see Regolamento di Ateneo per il deposito in ARCA), unless exceptions.
	Close access	Document available only to the author(s) , internal co-authors, authorized University staff.

3. Select the paper distribution licence among these kinds of licences:

<p>Accesso chiuso-personale / Close access</p>	<p>Publications are visible only to the authors, internal co-authors and the authorized University staff (including the Departmental commission members in case of internal evaluation procedures). This is the only option if you have selected <i>Close access</i>.</p>
<p>Accesso gratuito (solo visione)</p>	<p>Free open access publications are visible and easily quotable, yet they cannot be changed or used to derive other publications.</p>
<p>Accesso libero (no vincoli)</p>	<p>Free open access refers to maximum availability, it allows visibility, text circulation and the possible use for other publications, always respecting intellectual property (for related rights see the Creative Commons guidelines).</p>
<p><u>Pubblico dominio</u> / Public Domain</p>	<p>No right is reserved to the author, so it is allowed to copy, modify, distribute and perform the work for commercial purposes without any permission.</p>
<p><u>Creative Commons (CC)</u></p>	<p>It allows you to specify modifiability and reuse constraints, according to the scheme of Creative Commons licenses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Attribution (CC-BY): this license lets others distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon your work, even commercially, as long as they credit you for the original creation. This is the most accommodating of licenses offered. Recommended for maximum dissemination and use of licensed materials. ● Attribution-ShareAlike (CC BY-SA): this license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work even for commercial purposes, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms. All new works based on yours will carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. ● Attribution-NoDerivs (CC BY-ND): this license lets others reuse the work for any purpose, including commercially; however, it cannot be shared with others in adapted form, and credit must be provided to you. ● Attribution-NonCommercial (CC BY-NC): this license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work non-commercially, and although their new works must also acknowledge you and be non-commercial, they don't have to license their derivative works on the same terms. ● Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike (CC BY-NC-SA): this license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work non-commercially, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms. ● Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs (CC BY-NC-ND): this license is the most restrictive of our six main licenses, only allowing others to download your works and share them with others as long as they credit you, but they can't change them in any way or use them commercially. <p>For papers of Edizioni Ca' Foscari always select Creative Commons CC e check "Sì" in the next 2 questions in order to display the Attribution (CC-BY) licence.</p>
