Art. 1 - Definitions

1. Pursuant to this call, the following terms shall be understood as indicated:

- a) **University:** Ca' Foscari University of Venice
- b) **study programmes:** the study programmes established and activated at the university for the achievement of one of the academic qualifications referred to in the following point;
- c) **academic qualifications:** Bachelor's degree, Master's degree, PhD;
- d) **degree programmes of the old system:** the courses of the systems prior to Ministerial Decree no. 509/1999;
- e) **degree programmes of the new system:** the courses of the systems referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 509/1999 and Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004;
- f) **Master's degree programmes:** the courses of the systems referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004;
- g) **PhD programmes:** the courses of the systems referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 226/2021;
- h) **student:** a person enrolled in a study programme at the University;
- i) **credits:** the university credits provided for by Ministerial Decrees no. 509/1999 and no. 270/2004;
- j) **part-time student:** a person enrolled in a part-time study programme at the university pursuant to the Students Career Regulations issued on 7 January 2014 and subsequent amendments and additions;
- k) **financially independent student:** a student who meets both of the following conditions related to financial independence and paid accommodation;
 - According to the I.S.E.E. regulations established by D.P.C.M. 159/2013 and Ministerial Decree No. 1320/2021, Article 3, paragraph 1, the student must have been living outside the family home (i.e., not residing in the family's household) for at least two years prior to the date of submission of the DSU (Single Substitute Declaration), in a property not owned by a member of their family of origin;
 - Have had an adequate income from dependent or equivalent employment, declared for tax purposes for at least two years, with a gross annual income of no less than €9,000, based on a household composed of one person;

The student must also have paid accommodation that can be documented, meaning a rental contract or mortgage for the residence, in the student's name, regardless of whether the residence is located near the university attended.
- l) **Scholarship:** the Scholarship for the Right to University Education referred to in Articles 2 et seq. and 12 of Prime Ministerial Decree 9 April 2001;
- m) **eligible:** students who meet the income and merit requirements for admission to the scholarship assignment rankings;
- n) **beneficiary:** student who is awarded the scholarship;
- o) **ESU:** the ESU-Ardsu - Regional Agency for the Right to University Education;
- p) **DSU:** the self-certification form as referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013 and subsequent amendments and additions;
- q) **I.S.E.E.,** the household Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013 and subsequent amendments and additions;
- r) **I.S.E.E.E.:** the foreign household Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012;
- s) **I.S.E.E. for the financial aid for the right to university education:** the equivalent financial situation indicator of the student's household valid for the financial aid for the right to university education pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012 and to Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013 and subsequent amendments and additions;
- t) **I.S.P.E.,** the household Equivalent Asset Situation Indicator referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013 and subsequent amendments and additions;
- u) **I.S.E.E. Equivalent:** the equivalent financial situation indicator of the household of a foreign student or Italian student residing abroad identified by the Memorandum of Understanding concluded on 3 June 2015 between the National Association of Bodies for the Right to University Education (ANDISU) and the CAF centres (government office for tax assistance and information) registered on the Register of Tax Assistance Centres for employees who are members of the National Council;
- v) **Current I.S.E.E.:** the equivalent financial situation indicator that may be required if an I.S.E.E. certificate is already present for the financial aid for the right to university education and there has been a change in self-employed or employed work situation (or welfare, social security or indemnity payments, even exempt from personal income tax) or a variation in the total income of the household greater than 25%, pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 147 of 15 September 2017 and Legislative Decree no. 34 of 30 April 2019 and the amendments of Law 58 of 28 June 2019, or a decrease in the movable and immovable assets of the family unit (such as bank accounts, houses, etc.) by more than 20%, compared to what was owned on December 31 of the previous year and as indicated in the ordinary ISEE (2 years prior), as stated in the "Extensive Modalities of the Current ISEE" set forth in the Decree of the Minister of Labor and Social Policies, in agreement with the Minister of Economy and Finance, dated July 5, 2021 (published in the Official Gazette no. 203 on August 25, 2021), implementing paragraph 4 of Article 10 of Legislative Decree September 15, 2017, no. 147;
- w) **S.T.E.M. study programmes:** Bachelor's degree and Master's degree in fields such as science, technology, engineering and mathematics, which refer to the ministerial degree codes established by the Ministry according to the table on the webpage: <http://dati.ustat.miur.it/dataset/dati-per-bilancio-di>

Art. 2 - Purpose of the call

1. As part of the annual plan of action to implement the Right to University Education of the Veneto Region Veneto for the 2025/2026 academic year and in compliance with the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP) which allocates further financial resources, funded by both the European Union - Next Generation EU and the mission 4, component 1, investment 1.7 "Scholarships for University access" of the NRRP, the Ca' Foscari University of Venice issues the call for the assignment of scholarships for capable and deserving students in difficult financial conditions.
2. The aim of the Scholarship is to contribute to covering the maintenance costs incurred by students over at least ten months for each year of the course. The NRRP financial resources are aimed at increasing the number and the amount of the scholarships for capable and deserving students in difficult financial conditions.

Art. 3 - Categories of students who can apply for a Scholarship

1. The scholarship is awarded through competitive selection, according to the procedures established in this call:
 - a) to students enrolled in Bachelor's degree programmes, for a period of 7 semesters, starting from the first year of enrolment;
 - b) to students enrolled in Master's degree programmes, for a period of 5 semesters, starting from the first year of enrolment;
 - c) to students enrolled in PhD courses (with the exception of those enrolled under joint supervision and those who are assigned a scholarship for their PhD) for the duration provided for by the respective educational systems, starting from the first year of enrolment;
 - d) to part-time students, enrolled in Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes, for which the scholarship is awarded for a longer period of time, as indicated in Article 15 below;
 - e) to disabled students with a disability rating of at least 66% and to students with a recognized handicap pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 of Italian Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992, for whom the scholarship is granted for a longer period of time, in relation to the type of course attended, as indicated in Article 14 below.

The first year of enrollment is defined as the academic year in which a student enrolls for the first time at any university. Years of academic years are considered to include all years during which the student has been enrolled in any study programme, whether at this or another university, other than that in which they are currently enrolled. Therefore, the year of academic career may not coincide with the course year.

The calculation of academic years for applying for this benefit does not take into account possible years of course suspension.

Students who, following a previous withdrawal from courses or forfeiture of their place in a course, enrol in a course at another university, for the purpose of awarding the benefits referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree 9 April 2001, shall be considered enrolled for the first time and do not accumulate previous years of enrolment in other courses, running from the date of first enrolment, provided that they did not receive any scholarship during previous enrolment. Any credits acquired during previous enrolment cannot be included in calculations for merit for the purpose of awarding the scholarship during the new enrolment.

Students who, following a previous internal transfer in the same University or transfer to another University, enrol in a course of study, for the purposes of awarding the benefits referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree 9 April 2001 and Ministerial Decree 17 December 2021, no. 1320, shall accumulate previous years of enrolment in other courses, running from the date of first enrolment. Any credits acquired during previous enrolment can be included in calculations for merit for the purpose of awarding the scholarship during the new enrolment

2. The benefit is awarded to students studying for the relative level of study programme for the first time. The study programmes referred to in Ministerial Decree n. 509/1999 are considered equivalent to Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes, as identified in Article 3 of Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004. For the purpose of the award, the level of the degree titles already obtained in Italy or abroad will be taken into account.

The students referred to in paragraph 1 letter a) must not already have another degree, awarded either according to the system prior to Ministerial Decree n. 509/1999 or according to the new system, awarded in Italy or abroad or a diploma issued by a College of Music/Academy of Fine Arts, or a first-level academic diploma (Triennium) issued pursuant to Law no. 508/1999, or other equivalent qualification.

The students referred to in paragraph 1 letter b) must not already have a degree awarded according to the system prior to Ministerial Decree n. 509/1999, a degree awarded abroad considered to be second-level, a - specialisation degree, diploma issued by a College of Music/Academy of Fine Arts, second level academic diploma (Biennium) issued pursuant to Law no. 508/1999, or other equivalent qualification.

Students enrolled in an inter-university course will be required to submit their scholarship application to the university, the administrative headquarters of the course, where they pay the enrolment fees.

Students enrolled in two study programmes at the same time, even belonging to a College of Music/Academy of Fine Arts or to the same University, must choose one of the two study programmes as referring programme to access the benefits from the Right to University Education services for the whole duration of their simultaneous enrolment in the study programmes, as established by Law 12 April 2022, no. 33, art.1 and 2.

Students already enrolled in subsequent years of a study programme cannot choose the University of second enrolment or the course of second enrolment, if enrolled at the same University, for the purposes of applying for the Regional scholarship for the Right to university, if they have already been awarded the Regional Scholarship in their first study programme. If students enrolled in two study programmes have never been awarded the Regional Scholarship in the course of first enrolment, where they have not obtained their degree for the academic year referred to the requested benefit, they can apply for the Regional Scholarship in the course of second enrolment, provided that they have never applied for it before.

The student who does not declare the simultaneous enrolment by 15 November 2025 for bachelor's degree programmes or 17 December 2025 for master's degree programmes (following the provisions contained on the page <https://www.unive.it/pag/27540>) will not be entitled to the corresponding increase for the academic year 2025/2026 if they are eligible for the scholarship. The assignment of the status will depend on the date of submission of the declaration form.

In the case of students who transfer from another University, the status will be assigned after verifying the date of their transfer application from their former University, as stated in their transfer paper. The transfer request and the benefit request must be submitted by 30 September 2025.

3. Students who graduate with a Bachelor's degree or Master's degree within the duration foreseen by the respective educational systems will benefit from a scholarship supplement equal to half the amount awarded in the last year of the course, provided that there are available funds after the assignment of Regional Scholarships to all the eligible students enrolled in the academic year 2025/2026.

The scholarship is equal to 50% of the amount foreseen by Article 6, paragraph 2, 3, 4 and 5, net of the fees foreseen for the canteen service and the accommodation service, the latter calculated at a flat rate for students not living in the ESU residences in Venice is €1,600.00.

The supplement will be awarded giving priority to students who obtain their qualification within regular sessions, through a ranking ordered by income, considering the order of the degree sessions and giving priority to students with the lowest I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to university education.

4. Benefits can be granted to students who meet the requirements for admission to the course for which they are applying, regardless of the number of years that have passed since the achievement of the previous academic qualification.
5. Inmate students who may be enrolled in the study programmes at this university may apply for the scholarship award on the basis of the same criteria in force for non-inmate students; for the purpose of determining the amount of the scholarship, inmate students shall be considered local students.

Art. 4 - Deadlines and procedures for submitting applications

1. Students who may apply for the academic year 2025/2026 must:
 - a) For the academic year 2025/2026:
 - be enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes;
 - be enrolled for the first time in Master's degree programmes;
 - be enrolled from the second year onwards in Bachelor's degree programmes;
 - be enrolled from the second year onwards in Master's degree programmes;
 - be enrolled for the first time in PhD courses;
 - be enrolled from the second year onwards in PhD courses
 - b) have obtained an I.S.E.E. 2025 certificate valid for the benefits for the right to education / I.S.E.E. Corrente 2025 / I.S.E.E. Parificato 2025 (I.S.E.E. equivalent), with a value less than EUR 26.306,25 and an asset situation (ISPE) of less than EUR 42.530,50.
 - c) have obtained the merit requirement provided for by art.8 of the current Call

2. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, **all students** - regardless of whether they are already enrolled at the university or intend to enrol in Bachelor's degree, Master's degree programmes and PhD courses at the university - **must complete ALL of the following operations:**
 - a) **SUBMIT the scholarship application by 30 September 2025 at 12:30** - select the status with which you intend to participate (on site/commuter/non-resident – please check art.5). Failure to select the status leads to exclusion from the benefit. Fill in and submit the **"Benefits application"** available exclusively online in the reserved area of the university site in the section "Right to education and tuition fees"> *"Benefits application"*, or via the link <https://esse3.unive.it/auth/Autocertificazioni/Autocertificazione.do> for those not yet enrolled; the submission of the Benefits Application simultaneously authorises the University to receive from INPS all the information contained in the I.S.E.E. certificate.
 The non-deferrable deadline for submitting the scholarship application is set for **30 September 2025 at 12:30 pm** for all students.
If, having completed the Benefits Application, the benefits application is pending and the scholarship application is not sent, it shall not be accepted under any circumstances. Following successful submission of the application, a receipt will be issued which the applicant must save as proof of submission of the application; this receipt shall also be sent via email to the student's address (matriculationnumber@stud.unive.it) only if the applicant is already enrolled when they submit the application. It is also recommended that students print or save the receipt they receive at the end of the successful submission of the Benefit Application, because they will find there the progressive number that will be used to mention students in the ranking list instead of their matriculation number.
 - b) **REQUEST I.S.E.E. 2025 CERTIFICATE valid for "financial aid for the right to university education"** - by presenting the DSU to INPS – or Current I.S.E.E. or I.S.E.E. Equivalent, in the name of the student applying for the benefit, which must display their tax code, by the deadline shown in the table below (the date of presentation of the DSU shall be taken as proof).

If your ISEE certificate has omissions/non-conformities flagged by the Revenue Agency – whose presence students must verify autonomously, you can request a new ISEE certificate where the omissions/non-conformities are rectified. Alternatively, you can choose to still use the ISEE certificate with omissions/non-conformities by submitting a self-certification on a specific form that students must request to the Financial Aid Office; the form must be filled out and signed, then it can be sent to the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it). In case, all this process must be completed within the deadlines showed in the aforementioned table. For any further information regarding I.S.E.E. certificates, please refer to the provisions of Article 7 below.

If you have requested a new I.S.E.E. 2025 (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) after the one already acquired by the University (which can be viewed in the personal area under the Summary of Benefits Request section) and intend to have it taken into account, you must notify the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it) by the deadlines indicated above.

- c) **ENROL IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2025/2026** by paying the first instalment of fees and contributions by the deadline shown in the table below:

The total first instalment of fees and contributions is:

- **€500,00**, including the regional tax for the right to university education, for students in Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes (except as provided for the Bachelor's degree in "Digital Management" and the Bachelor's degree in "Hospitality, Innovation and e-Tourism"); Students who enrol for the first time or transfer from another University in the academic year 2025/2026 will be also charged a €16 stamp duty;
- **€189,00**, that is the amount of the regional tax for the right to university education, for students in PhD courses. Students who enrol for the first time in the academic year 2025/2026 will be also charged a €16 stamp duty.

The enrolment for the academic year 2025/2026 is considered valid if, in addition to the payment of the first instalment of tuition fees and contributions for the academic year 2025/2026, all amounts related to contributions (university fees, penalty fees, etc.) from previous academic years have already been settled.

Students who enrol in more than one study programme in the Veneto region Universities shall pay the amount of regional tax for the right to study only once to the University chosen as main place of study.

Failure or error in even one of the operations (referred to in letters a, b or c) described in this paragraph shall result in exclusion from the call.

After the closing of the call, no documentary additions or modification requests shall be admitted.

It will also be possible to check the progress of the aforementioned operations by connecting to your own reserved area in the section "Right to education and fees" > "*Summary of benefits application*", where you will find the serial number of the benefit request form you have submitted, it it has been submitted correctly.

3. Students enrolling in the second year onwards of Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes (with the exception of those enrolled in years beyond the prescribed duration of their programme for the 2025/2026 academic year) and students enrolling in the second or third year of PhD courses, who were eligible in the 2024/2025 academic year, only if they meet all the requirements set out in this call and subject to prior submission of the application for admission to the benefit, may pay, by 30 September 2025 – 11:59 pm, only the amount of €189,00, which equals to the amount of the regional tax for the right to study.

If the student fails to meet the requirements, fails to submit the scholarship application or is excluded from it, they must contact the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it) in advance to have the amount of fees recalculated; otherwise, the amount not paid during the enrolment phase of the academic year 2025/2026 (first and second instalments) will be added to any third instalment of fees due and must be settled in a single payment.

4. Students who transfer from another university may apply for the scholarship by registering on the Ca' Foscari website and submitting the Benefits Application by 12:30 pm on 30 September 2025, provided that they forward the transfer request made at the university of origin no later than the deadline of 30 September 2025 and meet the requirements set out in Articles 7 and 8 of this call. The merit requirements also take into consideration the years of enrolment at the university of origin. Students must complete the application procedure for the call by requesting the I.S.E.E. certificate and enrolling in the academic year 2025/2026 according to the procedures and deadlines described in letters b) and c) of paragraph 2 of this article.

Art. 5 - Definition of student status

1. For the purpose of accessing benefits, student status is defined—according to the classification "local / commuter / non-resident student" described below—based on the distance between the student's residence and the location of the degree program attended. The distance is calculated between the train station of the student's town of residence (or the bus station, particularly if no train station exists in the town of residence) and the train or bus station in the town where the course is held, using the fastest available public transportation. A student is classified as follows:
 - a) **local**, students residing in the municipality or in the area surrounding the location of the study programme attended (within 40 km). A student is also classified as local if they are enrolled in a study program that is conducted entirely or predominantly online, regardless of their place of residence in relation to the administrative location of the enrolled degree program.
 - b) **commuter**, students residing in a place that allows daily transfer to the location of the study programme attended within a distance of over 40 km and within 80 km and/or travel time of over 40 km and within 80 minutes; students resident in the municipality where the study programme is based may also be considered commuters, in relation to particular distances or travel times on public transport. The decision will be taken in accordance with ESU Venezia;
 - c) **non-resident**, students residing in a place far from the location of the study programme attended (over 80 km or over 80 minutes away) and who, for this reason, pay for accommodation near that location (i.e. in the municipality where the university is located or in a municipality classified as local), using public residential facilities or other private or corporate housing for a period of at least ten months (or five months in case of students applying for the scholarship exclusively for the last semester) with reference to the academic year 2025/2026. If a student resides in a place far from the course location but lives in accommodation near the course for free, they are considered a commuter student.

Students residing in a place far from the location of the attended study course who pay for accommodation near the course for a period of less than ten months (or less than five months for students who apply for the scholarship for the last semester), but who, in the same academic year, attend a study programme abroad (including work experience and internships, provided they are mandatory according to one's curriculum) promoted by the university, or who carry out an internship in Italy, regularly inserted in their exam booklet, or who attend the "Italian Erasmus" programme, in a place over 80 km or 80 minutes from their course of studies and the place of their residence, are in any case assigned the status of non-resident. In order to confirm their status, they are required to pay for accommodation abroad (in the place of their study programme) or in the Italian city where they carry out the internship or where the partner University of the "Italian Erasmus" programme is located, for a period that, combined with the period in Italy, is at least ten months (or at least five months for those who apply for the scholarship for the last semester). Students must present a copy of the rental contract translated into Italian or English, according to the procedures and timing indicated in paragraph 2 below.

For internships that are mandatory according to students' curriculum, the rental contract must be referred to the city where they carry out the internship. Rental contracts that last longer than the duration of the internship (as indicated in the training project) will not be accepted.

Students enrolled in PhD courses shall also be considered non-resident regardless of the place of residence and shall not be required to present any certification of election of domicile; in this case, the maximum amount of €540,00 for catering services shall be withheld from the scholarship.

Non-EU foreign students, whose household is not resident in Italy, are considered non-resident, regardless of the distance between the residence and the location of the study course. However, to confirm non-resident status, students must pay for accommodation in the municipality of the university attended or in a municipality classified as local, for a period of at least ten months (five months for those who apply for the scholarship for the last semester), with reference to the academic year 2025/2026, (therefore between September 2025 and September 2026) and they must meet the requirements outlined in paragraph 2 below. Students who do not meet the requirements will be considered commuter students.

“Financially independent” students, defined according to the requirements on art. 1, paragraph 1, letter k) and the respective note of this call, represent, for the purpose of the status and calculation of the grant due, a separate condition, for the allocation of which it is necessary to consider the plurality and specificity of the requirements that determine it.

The definition of **“local, commuter and non-resident”** student status, is made with reference to the tables available at universities and ESUs (Agencies for the Right to University Education), which can be consulted in Italian on the website www.unive.it/dirittoallostudio > Borse per il diritto allo studio, unless proven otherwise as provided by the student through the presentation of official documents issued by the transport service providers.

If the student's residence is included in the list of commuter or local municipalities in relation to the course venue, they cannot be considered non-resident, even if they present a legitimate rental contract.

2. **All the non-resident students**, including those who are staying in an ESU accommodation, **must fill in the online form** in the reserved area of the university website in the section “Right to study and education” > **“Upload non-resident rental contract”** **from 26 August 2025 to 31 October 2025**.

Non-resident students who do not use ESU residences in Venice or use them for only part of the year, when completing the online form **“Upload non-resident rental contract”**, in the period from 26 August 2025 to 31 October 2025, must attach a .pdf copy of the legally compliant paid **rental contract** with a duration of at least ten months (five months in case of those who apply for the scholarship for the last semester) or the remaining months to complete the planned ten (five if they apply for the scholarship for the last semester), if the contract is the first of two rental contracts whose overall duration is ten months (five months if they apply for the scholarship for the last semester), included in the period between September 2025 and September 2026.

All students, including those housed in ESU Residences, must fill the online form.

In the form students must indicate the beginning and the end date of the stay, the address at which they are residing, name and surname of the tenant or, in case of students residing in ESU Residences, the name of ESU structure.

Only and exclusively for students enrolled for the 2025/2026 academic year in a Master's degree programme, the deadline for completing the online form **“Upload non-resident rental contract”** and attaching the existing rental contract is set for 28 November 2025.

Students participating in a study programme abroad during the 2025/2026 academic year, therefore living in two different places during the said academic year, or those who change accommodation during the year (within a municipality classified as local), combining the periods to reach the minimum of ten months (five months for those who apply for the scholarship for the last semester), must:

- a) fill in the online form **“Upload non-resident rental contract”** in the period from 26 August 2025 to 31 October 2025 (or 28 November for students enrolled in a Bachelor's degree course, with non-EU citizenship, or for students enrolled in a Master's course) and attach a .pdf copy of the first of the two paid contracts valid for the first semester (foreign if taking part in a study programme abroad in the first semester, or sited in the municipality classified as local);
- b) send a .pdf copy of the second of the two paid contracts via e-mail to dirittoallostudio@unive.it (foreign if taking part in a study programme abroad in the second semester, or sited in the municipality classified as local), no later than 15 April 2026.

The two contracts presented must have immediate continuity between them.

The online form **“Upload non-resident rental contract”** can be filled out only once. Any corrections to a form that has already been completed and submitted must be reported to the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it) by the deadlines indicated in paragraph a) above.

Students applying for the benefit must necessarily be the signatory or co-signatory of the rental contract.

The rental contract must be accompanied by proof of registration with the National Revenue Agency and a copy of the annual payment receipt of registration tax. If the rental contract expires during the year and is extended, the student must send proof of registration of the extension by the Revenue Agency via email to dirittoallostudio@unive.it, within 30 days of expiry of the contract.

If students withdraw early from the submitted rental contract, they must promptly inform the Financial Aid Office, writing an email to dirittoallostudio@unive.it.

Failure to comply with the indications outlined in this paragraph shall result in the official revaluation of status from non-resident to commuter.

3. Students who take part in international mobility programmes shall, in any case, retain the scholarship originally awarded (off site scholarship, commuter scholarship, on site scholarship), with no possibility of changing status and increasing the aforementioned scholarship. However, they must still fulfil the necessary requirements for the definition of the status (*e.g. non-resident: to maintain this status, they must satisfy the living requirements in the town/city where the study programme is based for at least ten months, as indicated in the aforementioned paragraphs*).

Art. 6 - Loans and amounts

1. In order to award the scholarship for the 2025/2026 academic year, funds have been set aside deriving from:
 - a) the proceeds from the regional tax for the right to university education;
 - b) from the portion of the state supplementary fund specifically set up pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 68/2012;
 - c) from any additional resources of the Veneto Region pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 68/2012.
 - d) from any available resources of the National Recovery and resilience Plan (NRRP): initiative by Next Generation EU, funded by the European Union, mission 4, component 1, investment 1.7.
 - f) from any available resources of the European Social Fund.

The aforementioned resources, as soon as they are quantified, will be used to finance the first ranking of eligible candidates that will be drawn up in accordance with Article 9 below.

The financial resources are divided among the various rankings, referred to in Article 9 below, using the following criteria:

- 30% to those enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes. This percentage is divided according to students' citizenship and entry qualification (e.g. *high school diploma for bachelor's degree courses, bachelor's degree for master's degree courses*) as follows:
 - 93% to those enrolled for the first time who hold an entry qualification obtained in Italy or in an EU country, without distinction of citizenship;
 - 7% to those enrolled for the first time with non-EU citizenship who hold an entry qualification which has been obtained neither in Italy nor in an EU country;
- 70% to those enrolled in the second year onwards of all courses (Bachelor's and Master's degree regardless of citizenship or place where they have obtained their entry qualification).

Those enrolled in PhD programmes who do not benefit from the scholarship referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 226/2021, are assigned a total number of scholarships that does not exceed the percentage ratio between those eligible for the Scholarship in the 2025/2026 academic year and the total number of enrolled students.

2. The total scholarship for **non-resident** students changes according to their financial condition and their enrolment as follows:
 - a) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education between 50% and 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. between €13.153,12 and €17.537,50): Scholarship amount equals to €7.072,10, of which €760,00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - b) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education below 50% of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. that is equal or below €13.153,11): Scholarship amount (increased by 15% as compared to students outlined in letter a) equals to €8.132,91, of which €760,00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - c) Students with an I.S.E.E. financial aid for the right to education above 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 and in any case not above the maximum (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. between €17.537,51 and €26.306,25): Scholarship amount *between €7.072,09 and €3.536,00*, of which €760,00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - d) Students enrolled in two study programmes at the same time: Scholarship amount is increased by 20% on condition that students meet the merit requirements outlined in art.8 for both the courses in which they are enrolled and for the whole duration of the courses. The increase is not due if students lose the requirements for the scholarship for the study programme where they have been awarded the increased scholarship. The 20% increase cannot be combined with the one established on letter e). Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17;
 - e) Female gender students enrolled in S.T.E.M. Bachelor's or Master's degrees: Scholarship amount is increased by 20%. This increase cannot be combined with the one indicated on letter b) and d). Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17;
3. The total scholarship for **commuter** students is as follows:
 - a) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education between 50% and 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. between 13.153,12 Euro and 17.537,50 Euro): Scholarship amount equals to €4.132,85, of which €540,00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;

- b) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education below 50% of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. that is equal or below €13.153,11). Scholarship amount (increased by 15% as compared to students outlined in letter a) equals to €4.752,77of which €540.00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - c) Students with an I.S.E.E. financial aid for the right to education above 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 and in any case not above the maximum (meaning, with an I.S.E.E. between €17.537,51 and €26.306,25): Scholarship amount *between €4.132,84 and €2.066,42*, of which €540.00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - d) Students enrolled in two study programmes at the same time Scholarship amount is increased by 20% according to letter a), b) and c), on condition that students meet the merit requirements outlined in art.8 for both the courses in which they are enrolled and for the whole duration of the courses. The increase is not due if students lose the requirements for the scholarship for the study programme where they have been awarded the increased scholarship. The 20% increase cannot be combined with the one established on letter e). Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17;
 - e) Female gender students enrolled in S.T.E.M. Bachelor's or Master's degrees: Scholarship amount is increased by 20%. This increase cannot be combined with the one indicated on letter b) or with the one indicated on letter d). Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17;
4. The total scholarship for **local** students is as follows:
- a) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education between 50% and 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (that is between €13.153,12 and €17.537,50): Scholarship amount equals to €2.850,26 of which €250.00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - b) Students with an I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to education below 50% of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 (that is equal or below €13.153,11): Scholarship amount (increased by 15% as compared to students outlined in letter a) equals to €3.277,79 of which €250.00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - c) Students with an I.S.E.E. financial aid for the right to education above 2/3 of the maximum amount as established by art.7, paragraph 13 and in any case not above the maximum (that is between €17.537,51 and €26.306,25): Scholarship amount *between €2.850,25 and €1.425,13* of which €250.00 are necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship;
 - d) Students enrolled in two study programmes at the same time: Scholarship amount is increased by 20% on condition that students meet the merit requirements outlined in art.8 for both the courses in which they are enrolled and for the whole duration of the courses. The increase is not due if students lose the requirements for the scholarship for the study programme where they have been awarded the increased scholarship. The 20% increase cannot be combined with the one established on letter e). The Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17;
 - e) Female gender students enrolled in S.T.E.M. Bachelor's or Master's degrees: Scholarship amount is increased by 20%. This increase cannot be combined with the one indicated on letter b) and d). Scholarship amounts are outlined in the tables below on paragraph 17.
5. The scholarship amount for a **financially independent** student (i.e., one who meets the requirements outlined in letter k) of Article 1, paragraph 1)—regardless of whether they are classified as non-resident, commuter, or local—will correspond to the standard amount of €7,072.10, from which €760.00 will be necessarily deducted for the canteen service and will be paid to Venice ESU, whether or not students use the service. If the canteen service is not provided for by Venice ESU, this amount will not be deducted from the scholarship
- The scholarship amount is subject to increases as described in letters b), d), and e) of the previous paragraphs 2, 3, and 4. The amount of the scholarship is not reduced for students whose I.S.E.E. (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) for financial aid purposes exceeds two-thirds of the maximum threshold referred to in Article 7, paragraph 13, as long as it does not exceed the maximum limit (i.e., for I.S.E.E. between €17,537.51 and €26,306.25).
6. To the students who fall into one or more categories eligible for an increase in the scholarship amount (e.g., *female gendered student enrolled in S.T.E.M. Bachelor/Master's courses while simultaneously meeting the requirements for independent student status, or a student simultaneously enrolled in two degree programs while*

meeting the requirements for independent student status, etc.), and who are classified as winners of the scholarship, priority will be given to the most favourable economic scenario for the recipient.

7. In the cases of awarding of the Scholarship for the seventh semester of Bachelor's degree courses and for the fifth semester of Master's degree courses, the total Scholarship and the deduction for the catering service provided by the Venice ESU are reduced by 50%.
8. Students enrolled in the second year onwards eligible for the Scholarship because they meet the requirements relating to merit and financial situation, but do not receive it due to lack of resources, can use the catering service free of charge.
9. For students enrolled in the first year, eligible for the Scholarship with non-resident or commuter status but who do not receive it due to lack of resources, the Venice ESU shall apply a rate of €2,70 per meal. If these students become a scholarship recipient during the 2025/2026 academic year or at the end of the academic year, they can request a refund for the rate paid by contacting the Venice ESU directly.
10. Students who have been granted the scholarship and who participate in an international mobility programme can request ESU Venice a partial reimbursement of the share of their scholarship intended for the canteen service. Their request must be done at the end of their mobility programme, on condition that the programme has an academic recognition in terms of credits for their course of study in Italy. The share of the scholarship intended for the refectories service shall be reimbursed by ESU Venice according to the number of months of absence (from Ca' Foscari University) reported by the host University.
11. For non-resident and/or financially independent students who use the residential facilities of the Venice ESU (including students who have been awarded the last semester scholarship) a quota of €1.600,00 is deducted, corresponding to the standard rate due for the accommodation service; the University shall pay this sum to the Venice ESU or, at the agency's request, to the managers indicated by it.
12. The remaining amount due for accommodation shall be paid by the student directly to the Venice ESU, within the deadline set by the agency.
13. Students eligible and/or beneficiaries of the scholarship are exempt from paying the fees and contributions due for the 2025/2026 academic year (with the exception of those who enrolled at University through the "Formazione PA 110 e lode" project). The fees and contributions paid in the first instalment (with the exclusion of stamp duty) shall be refunded ex officio by 31 July 2026.
14. Students eligible and/or beneficiaries of the Scholarship for an additional semester beyond the normal duration of the Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes, established by the educational systems as per Ministerial Decree no. 509/1999 and Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004, shall be granted total exemption for the regional tax for the right to university education and the 50% exemption for fees (with the exception of those who enrolled at University through the "Formazione PA 110 e lode" project). The fees and contributions paid in the first instalment, if the payment was not due, (with the exclusion of stamp duty) shall be refunded ex officio by 31 July 2026.
15. The scholarship, assigned in accordance with the rankings referred to in Article 9 below, shall be paid in full to the successful applicants whose I.S.E.E. for financial aid for the right to university education is no more than €17.537,50.
16. For higher values, until the aforementioned maximum limits are reached, the scholarship, assigned in accordance with the rankings referred to in Article 9 below, shall be gradually reduced to half the amount using the following formula:

$$\text{Maximum amount of the Scholarship} - [(\text{I.S.E.E. value} - € 17.537,50) * \text{Reduction Coefficient}]$$

The aforementioned reduction coefficient is calculated as follows:

$$(\text{Maximum Amount of the Scholarship} / 2) / (€ 26.306,25 - € 17.537,51)$$

17. The amounts of the Scholarships, in accordance to the type of enrolment, the status and the values of I.S.E.E., are listed in the following tables:

If students enrolled in the 2025/2026 academic year with full-time status later switch to part-time status, please refer to Article 15, paragraph 9 for the applicable provisions.

18. Regional scholarships may be combined with other scholarships that do not have similar purposes related to student maintenance, regardless of the reason for which they are assigned. Scholarships granted by national or foreign institutions to support education or research abroad (mobility grants) are compatible. If students awarded a regional scholarship have already won, or simultaneously win another scholarship (with the exception of mobility grants), they must opt for one or the other scholarship, giving notice within 15 days to the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it). Students who give up the regional scholarship also lose their eligibility for the related benefits (i.e. exemption from the payment of fees, subsidised catering and housing services).

Art. 7 - I.S.E.E. and criteria for the evaluation of the financial situation

1. The financial situation of students is identified according to the I.S.E.E. certificate, as referred to in Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013 and subsequent amendments and additions;
2. To request the 2025 I.S.E.E. certificate for “**financial aid for the right to university education**”, students must complete the DSU (self-certification), which includes information on the household unit and on the income and assets of each member of the household. This can be done directly in the Online Services section of the INPS website (www.inps.it), or with the help of a Tax Support Centre (CAF) or a qualified professional.

The ISEE must be issued specifically for the student applying for the benefit, and must show their tax code. In the case of two (or more) students belonging to the same household both requesting the benefit, the I.S.E.E. certificate must indicate that it applies to each student, whose tax codes must all be displayed. The University will automatically import the I.S.E.E. certificate only if it has been prepared in accordance with the characteristics described above and if the student has properly submitted the benefit application. **I.S.E.E. certificates for university use will not be taken into consideration if the benefit application has not been submitted or if the request is made after the specified deadline;** for this purpose, the submission date on the DSU receipt will be considered valid. Therefore, the I.S.E.E. 2025 certificate in paper format should not be submitted to the University.

If your ISEE certificate has omissions/non-conformities flagged by the Revenue Agency – which students must verify autonomously - you can request a new ISEE certificate where the omissions/non-conformities are rectified. Alternatively, you can choose to still use the ISEE certificate with omissions/non-conformities by using a self-certification on a specific form that students must request in advance to the Financial Aid Unit. The self-certification must be filled out and signed, then sent to the Financial Aid Unit (*dirittoallostudio@unive.it*). In any case the deadlines for the submission are indicated in art.4 paragraph 2, letter b).

3. Students may decide to submit the Current I.S.E.E. 2025, pursuant to Article 10, paragraph 5 of Legislative Decree no. 147 of 15/09/2017, as amended by Art. 28-bis of Legislative Decree no. 34 of 30/04/2019, converted, with amendments, by Law 28/06/2019, n.58. The Current I.S.E.E. must be valid as of the scholarship application deadline (30 September 2025), and it can be submitted in one of the following cases:
 - a change in the work situation, as referred to in Article 9, paragraph 1, letters a), b) and c) of Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159/2013; or
 - a change in the indicator of the current income situation of more than twenty five percent, as referred to in the same Article 9, paragraph 2; or
 - an interruption of the benefits foreseen by Article 4, paragraph 2, letter f) of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159/2013,
 - A decrease of more than 20% in the family household's movable and immovable assets (such as bank accounts, properties, etc.) compared to what was owned on December 31 of the previous year and what is indicated in the ordinary ISEE (2 years prior) can be found in the "Extended Modalities of the current ISEE" as referred to in the Ministerial Decree of the Ministry of Labor and Social Policies, in conjunction with the Ministry of Economy and Finance, dated July 5, 2021 (published in the G.U. No. 203 on August 25, 2021), which implements Article 10, paragraph 4 of Legislative Decree No. 147 of September 15, 2017,

The Current I.S.E.E. 2025 and its I.S.R.E. income component are calculated on the basis of an I.S.E.E. certificate applicable to valid benefits for the right to education.

Students must clearly notify the Financial Aid Office (*dirittoallostudio@unive.it*), within the deadline for the submission of the scholarship application of 30 September 2025, their intention to apply the Current I.S.E.E., indicating the INPS registration number of this certificate if the university has already acquired the data of a previous I.S.E.E. 2025 certificate valid for the right to education.

4. For the purposes of granting the benefits referred to in Article 3, the student's household is defined according to the methods outlined in Prime Ministerial Decree 5 December 2013 and in particular Article 8.
5. In the case of parents not cohabiting with the student making the application, the applicant enrolled even in PhD courses shall be considered part of the parents' household, unless both of the following requirements to be considered a financially independent student for ISEE purposes are met (residence and income requirements):
 - a) residence outside the family home, for at least two years prior to the application for their Single Substitute Declaration (DSU), in accommodation not owned by a family member;
 - b) income from dependent employment or similar income declared for tax purposes, for at least two years, of at least €9,000.00 per year, with reference to a one-person household (referring to the gross income declared in the income tax return declaration of the last two years).
6. The parents of applicant students who are not cohabiting are generally considered part of the same household, defined according to the procedures referred to in Article 3, paragraph 2 of Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159/2013, with the exception of the cases referred to in Article 3, paragraph 3 of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree if married, and the cases referred to in Article 7, paragraph 1 of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree if unmarried. Should the cases referred to in Article 7, paragraph 1 of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree apply, the I.S.E.E. is supplemented with an additional component, calculated on the basis of the financial situation of the non-cohabiting parent, according to the procedures referred to in Annex 2, paragraph 2 of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree.
7. For Phd students applying for benefits, the household is composed exclusively of the applicant, their spouse, children under the age of 18, as well as adult children, according to the rules referred to in paragraphs 2 to 5 of Article 3 of Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159/2013, and in any case without prejudice to the possibility for the beneficiary to establish the household according to the ordinary rules referred to in Article 3 of the aforementioned Prime Ministerial Decree (INPS Circular no. 171 of 18 December 2014 under the subject header "Riforma I.S.E.E. D.P.C.M. n. 159/2013").

8. Pursuant to Article 8, paragraph 3 of Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012, the financial situation of **foreign students or Italian students residing abroad** is defined through the I.S.E.E., calculated as the sum of income received abroad and 20% of assets owned abroad, valued according to the procedures referred to in Article 7, paragraph 7 of Legislative Decree no.68 of 29 March 2012. Pending the adoption of the decree referred to in Article 7, paragraph 7 of Legislative Decree no. 68/2012, the financial situation of foreign students or Italian students residing abroad is defined through the I.S.E.E. Equivalent , as established by the Memorandum of Understanding concluded on 03/06/2015 between the National Association of Bodies for the Right to University Education (ANDISU) and the CAF centres (government office for tax assistance and information) registered on the Register of Tax Assistance Centres for employees who are members of the National Council.
9. In order to obtain an I.S.E.E. Equivalent students must book an appointment **only with the CAF affiliated with the university** and must present the list of documents necessary for the calculation of the I.S.E.E. Equivalent; in the absence of such documents, the CAF will not issue an **I.S.E.E. 2025 Equivalent**. The operating methods for calculating the I.S.E.E. Equivalent will be indicated at the address <https://www.unive.it/pag/49911/> > ISEE and Benefit Application. The licensed CAF will send the data related to the student's I.S.E.E. Equivalent to the University.
10. Non-EU students, under the same treatment as Italian students, shall access the services and measures for the right to education pursuant to Article 46, paragraph 5 of Presidential Decree no. 394 of 31 August 1999.
Pursuant to the aforementioned Article 46, paragraph 5 of Presidential Decree no. 394/1999, the financial and asset situation of non-EU students - regardless of whether the country of origin is classified as a low human developing country according to Ministerial Decree 166 of March 3, 2025 - shall be certified by specific documentation issued by the competent authorities of the country in which the income was produced and translated into Italian by the relevant local Italian diplomatic authorities. This documentation is issued by the competent foreign diplomatic or consular representatives in Italy, for countries in which it is particularly difficult to obtain certification from the local Italian Embassy, and legalized by the prefectures pursuant to Article 33 of Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28 December 2000. For the purpose of evaluating the economic condition, for students recognized as political refugees, stateless individuals, and beneficiaries of subsidiary or temporary protection, only incomes and assets held in Italy are taken into consideration.
11. The above documentation must be accompanied by documentation confirming the availability of sufficient means for the duration of time in Italy and for return to the country of origin, as established by Article 4 ("Provisions on entry and stay") of Legislative Decree no. 286 of 25 July 1998.
12. The I.S.P.E. (Equivalent Asset Situation Indicator) is calculated directly by the University on the basis of the data shown in the I.S.E.E. certificate, according to the following formula: $I.S.P.E. = I.S.P. \text{ value} / \text{equivalence scale value}$.
13. For access to the benefit referred to in Article 3, the I.S.E.E. certificate for financial aid for the right to university education/Current I.S.E.E./I.S.E.E. Equivalent must not exceed the cap of €26.306,25.
14. Pursuant to Article 8, paragraph 3 of Legislative Decree no. 68/2012 and Article 2, paragraph 1 of Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013, and as defined by the Deliberazione Giunta Regionale del Veneto n. 774 of 8 July 2025, students for whom the household I.S.P.E. referred to in paragraph 12 above exceeds the cap of €42.530,50 shall be in any case excluded from the benefit.

Art. 8 - Criteria for determining merit

1. Students who are enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes shall be awarded the scholarship solely on the basis of the I.S.E.E. requirements referred to in Article 7 above. The merit requirement for access to benefits is assessed ex post in accordance with the provisions of Article 11, paragraph 1 below.
2. Students who are enrolled for the first time in PhD programmes shall be awarded the scholarship solely on the basis of the I.S.E.E. requirements referred to in Article 7 above.
3. Students enrolled for the first time in PhD courses are only required to be admitted to the courses according to the procedures established by the respective teaching systems in order to access the benefit.
4. Student enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes receive the second instalment of the scholarship provided that they have obtained 20 credits, without credit transfer from previous academic careers or exemptions, by 10 August 2026. The bonus referred to in paragraph 6 cannot be used to achieve this merit requirement.
5. The merit requirements for access to the benefit for students enrolled in the second year onwards of Bachelor's degree programmes are as follows:
 - a) fulfilment of any educational obligations where required at the time of admission to the courses;
 - b) for the second year, 25 credits by 10 August 2025;
 - c) for the third year, 80 credits by 10 August 2025;
 - d) for the final semester, 135 credits by 10 August 2025;
6. Students can use a 'bonus' in addition to the actual credits earned. The "bonus" does not interfere with the definition of the merit index referred to in paragraph 14 below but can be used (where necessary) exclusively to

achieve the merit requirement required for each year (see previous paragraph). The bonus is valid once only during the study programme and has different values based on the year in which it is used:

- a) 5 credits, if used to obtain the benefit for the second academic year;
 - b) 12 credits, if used to obtain the benefit for the third academic year;
 - c) 15 credits, if used to obtain the benefit for subsequent academic years;
7. The bonus is considered used if it is actually necessary to achieve the requirements. The bonus quota not used in the academic year in which it was requested can be used in the subsequent ones only for the residual part (e.g. if you request the bonus for obtaining the scholarship for the second academic year and you use 3 credits out of 5 credits, for all your subsequent years you will be able to use the remaining 2 credits only).
8. The merit requirements for access to the benefit required of the student enrolled in the second year onwards of Master's degree programmes are as follows:
- a) for the second year, 30 credits by 10 August 2025;
 - b) for the final semester, 80 credits by 10 August 2025;
9. To achieve the merit requirement referred to in paragraph 8, students may use the bonus accrued and not used in the previous Bachelor's degree programme (e.g. if the bonus was never requested during the Bachelor's degree programme, you still have 15 bonus credits available for the Master's programme).

Students enrolled in a master's degree from the academic year 2023/2024 onwards, whose entry qualification is a degree obtained abroad, will not be able to use the bonus.

10. In case of transfer from another University, internal course transfer or option, only the credits earned for the study programme for which the student requests the benefit shall be valid.
11. In order to meet the merit requirement referred to in paragraphs 5 and 8, students can also use credits obtained from exams taken after enrolment in the bachelor's or master's degree program for which the scholarship for the right to study is being requested, but only in the following cases:
- Simultaneous enrolment in two degree programs;
 - participation into the "Italian Erasmus" programme;
 - "Minor" or "Advanced course", provided that the program has been fully completed and the exams have been pre-included in the study plan.
12. Except as provided in the previous paragraph, credits earned from the following shall not be considered valid:
- exams/internships acknowledged in previous academic careers concluded with the award of the qualification or following withdrawal/forfeiture or other activities, even held before enrolment, for which an exemption has been granted in the career;
 - exams taken as single courses prior to enrolment in the Bachelor's degree and/or Master's degree programmes;
 - exams that have not been completed (partial exams shall not be considered).
13. Students enrolled in the second year onwards of PhD courses must meet the requirements for enrolment in the subsequent years foreseen by the respective teaching systems.
14. For students enrolled in the second year onwards of Bachelor's degree programmes and Master's degree programmes, the ranking is defined on the basis of the merit identified according to the number of credits and the average grade of the student in relation to the number of credits envisaged pursuant to the paragraphs 5 and 8 above and to the reference average. The reference average is given by the average of the grades achieved by the students in the same exams and in the same academic year as the applicant student. The merit index (*I*) is given by the difference between the number of credits held by the student (*CS*) and the minimum number of credits required for access (*CR*), to which is added the difference between the average grade of the student (*MS*) and the reference average grade (*MR*) multiplied by a different weighting coefficient (*P*) for each degree programme, inversely proportional to the difference between 30 and the degree programme average. The merit index is therefore calculated according to the following formula:

$$I = (CS - CR) + P * (MS - MR)$$

15. Merit calculations do not consider the number of yearly course credits, the number of credits and the years of enrolment at non-Italian universities prior to the year of first enrolment at an Italian university authorized to issue legally valid qualifications.
16. The calculation of the number of academic years in the careers of students enrolled in the program with "part-time" status is determined as follows:
- Two academic years attended with "part-time" status are counted as one "full-time" year;
 - A single academic year attended with "part-time" status will still be considered as one "full-time" year;
 - In the event of the revocation of "part-time" status, two academic years attended with "part-time" status will both be counted as "full-time" years (e.g., if a student enrolled in the academic year 2023/2024 are revoked the "part-time" status for the period 2023/2024 and 2024/2025 previously granted, those academic years will

be counted as “full-time,” and therefore the academic year 2025/2026 will be considered a third year of “full-time” enrolment, resulting in a reassessment of merit requirements for eligibility to benefits such as reduction of tuition fees and scholarships).

For students who enrolled in the program with “full-time” status and later switched to “part-time” status during their academic career, each academic year attended as “full-time” will be counted as two “part-time” years for the purpose of determining the number of years and the related merit requirements, as outlined in the table above.

Art. 9 - Ranking formation

1. Pursuant to Article 4, paragraph 7 of Prime Ministerial Decree 9 April 2001, the benefit rankings for the 2025/2026 academic year shall be defined according to the following procedures:

- a) by 31 October 2025, the rankings for admission to and exclusion from the benefit shall be approved and structured as follows:
- ranking of those enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes, without distinction of citizenship, who hold an entry qualification obtained in Italy or in a European Union country, defined in ascending order on the basis of the I.S.E.E. certificate referred to in Article 7 above;
 - ranking of those enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes, without EU citizenship, who do not hold an entry qualification obtained in Italy or in a European Union country, defined in ascending order on the basis of the I.S.E.E. certificate referred to in Article 7 above;
 - ranking for students enrolled in the second year onwards of Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, defined on the basis of merit, with reference to the criteria referred to in Article 8 above, published according to methods that take into account the number of credits and marks achieved, making it possible to compare the individual merit parameters of the students;
 - ranking of students enrolled in PhD courses (who do not benefit from the scholarship referred to in Ministerial Decree 226/2021), defined in ascending order on the basis of the I.S.E.E. certificate referred to in Article 7 above.

Students who find any irregularities in the aforementioned rankings, published by 31 October 2025, or who have switched their status from full-time to part-time or from part-time to full-time after the submission of the scholarship application, must fill in and send a “Segnalazione di Rilievo” report available on the university website www.unive.it/dirittoallostudio > Borse per il diritto allo studio, by 15 November 2025. Reports received after the above deadline shall not be considered.

- b) by 23 December 2025 the scholarship assignment rankings with the definitive indication of their status – on site/commuter/off-site will be approved for students enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes, students enrolled in the second year onwards in Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes and students enrolled in PhD courses.
- c) by 21 January 2026 the rankings for admission to and exclusion from the benefit shall be approved and structured as follows:
- ranking of those enrolled for the first time in Master's degree programmes, without distinction of citizenship, who hold an entry qualification obtained in Italy or in a European Union country, defined in ascending order on the basis of the I.S.E.E. certificate referred to in Article 7 above;
 - ranking of those enrolled for the first time in Master's degree programmes, without EU citizenship, who do not hold an entry qualification obtained in Italy or in a European Union country, defined in ascending order on the basis of the I.S.E.E. certificate referred to in Article 7 above;

Students who find any irregularities in this ranking must fill in and send a “Segnalazione di Rilievo” report, available on the university website www.unive.it/dirittoallostudio > Borse per il diritto allo studio, by 5 February 2026. Reports received after the above deadline shall not be considered.

- d) by 13 February 2026, the scholarship assignment rankings for students enrolled for the first time in Master's degree programmes (with the definitive indication of their status – on site/commuter/ off-site) will be approved;
2. **Students must consult the rankings** in the reserved area of the university website in the “Right to education and tuition fees” section, to ascertain that they are eligible or see possible reasons for exclusion.
3. Each student shall be listed in the ranking list with the serial number issued in the receipt obtained after the correct submission of the Benefit request form referred to in Art.4 of this call.

Art. 10 - Methods of payment of the scholarship

1. The monetary part of the scholarship shall be paid in two equal half-yearly instalments.
2. The first six-monthly instalment of the scholarship shall be paid to the beneficiary student no later than 31 December 2025, except for students enrolled for the first time in a Master's degree programme, for which the deadline is deferred to 28 February 2026.

3. The accommodation fee of €1,600.00 (Article 6 paragraph 11) is deducted from the first instalment, where applicable.
4. For students enrolled in the second year onwards of Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, for students enrolled in PhD courses, the second instalment of the scholarship shall be paid no later than 30 June 2026.
5. For students enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes, the second instalment of the scholarship shall be paid by 30 September 2026, if at least 20 credits have been earned by 10 August 2026 (10 CFU for part-time students). The bonus referred to in Article 8, paragraph 6 cannot be used to achieve this merit requirement.
6. The scholarship instalments shall be paid within the deadlines indicated in paragraphs 2, 4 and 5 above, **via payment to the Ca' Foscari CartaConto only. CartaConto must be necessarily activated within 30 days from receiving it** and in any case before 15 November 2025 or, only for students enrolled in a master's degree program, before 30 January 2026, so as to receive the amount of granted scholarship by the timeframe indicated on paragraph 2.

The Ca' Foscari CartaConto shall be the sole method of paying the instalments of any scholarship awarded and refunding the instalment paid for enrolment in the academic year 2025/2026 (with the exception of stamp duty). Activating CartaConto later than the deadlines indicated above will result in the postponement of the only remaining attempt to pay the scholarship, which will take place within six months from the date the scholarship award decision is issued. Failure to activate the CartaConto or a significant delay in activation will result in the inability to receive the funds.

Art. 11 - Revocation/forfeiture of the scholarship and relative eligibility

1. The scholarship, and relative eligibility, shall be revoked for students enrolled for the first time in Bachelor's degree programmes and Master's degree programmes who, by 30 November 2026, have failed to earn at least 20 credits (10 credits for part-time students), considered valid for the study programme in which the student is enrolled in or, alternatively, for the study programme in which they will enrol in the academic year 2026/2027, if different from the course above. The bonus referred to in Article 8, paragraph 6 cannot be used to achieve this merit requirement.
2. In exceptional cases upon request with duly documented justification, subject to the approval of the Veneto Regional Authority, the deadline for achieving the minimum merit requirements to avoid revocation may be deferred to 28 February 2027.
3. Students who fail to earn the credits required under paragraph 1 above by 30 November 2026 must also pay the proportion of fees and contributions established by the administrative regulations in force at the university.
4. Scholarship holders and eligible non-beneficiaries who fail to earn, by the deadline of 10 August 2026, the right to receive the second instalment of the scholarship, and who have not been subject to revocation of the benefit, must pay 50% of the fees and contributions due for the academic year 2025/2026 as established by the administrative regulations in force at the university.
5. In addition to the case described in paragraph 1 above, students enrolled in Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes will also have the scholarship and its eligibility revoked in the case of:
 - a) withdrawal from the study programme for the academic year 2025/2026 by 10 August 2026;
 - b) transfer to another university for the academic year 2025/2026 by 10 August 2026.

Students must contact the Financial Aid Office at least 15 days before the submission of the application for transfer or withdrawal in order to understand the amounts due following revocation of the scholarship and how to repay them. Revocation also implies forfeiture by the student of the right to any fee and tax refunds.

6. The scholarship shall be revoked for students enrolled in PhD courses who withdraw from the study programme for the 2025/2026 academic year by 10 August 2026.
 7. Scholarships awarded for the academic year 2025/2026 shall be revoked for beneficiaries who graduate in the extraordinary session of the academic year 2024/2025. In this case, students must return the amounts already received, according to the procedures and times established by the Financial Aid Office and in any case before the date of graduation.
 8. In case of revocation or forfeiture of the benefit, students must return the monetary amount of the scholarship according to the procedures and times established by the University and they must return the sum corresponding to the value of the catering and/or accommodation services actually used by the student during the year and calculated according to the maximum rate and, for the canteen service, according to the calculation of ESU Venice.
- Students subject to revocation or forfeiture of the benefit must pay the proportion of fees and contributions established by the administrative regulations in force at the University
9. Students who, after being awarded the benefit for the 2025/2026 academic year, have their status redefined as a result of a review by the office (*e.g., from out-of-town to commuter, as per Article 5*), or who change their enrolment status from full-time to part-time, will have the scholarship amount recalculated and will receive a notice from the Financial Aid Office regarding the need to repay any amount no longer due.

For this reason, students are strongly encouraged to promptly inform the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it) of any changes occurring after the call deadline, and in particular, to request any change from full-time to part-time status by November 15, 2025 (see also Article 15).

Art. 12 - Supplements and benefits for international mobility

1. Eligible students who are not assigned a scholarship and scholarship beneficiaries in the academic year 2025/2026 who take part in international mobility programmes during the same academic year, enrolled in Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes and PhD courses that do not benefit from the scholarship referred to in Ministerial Decree 226/2021, may apply for international mobility contributions, subject to the availability of resources and only once for each course.
2. International mobility is understood to mean the "Erasmus+ for European study" programmes, both managed by Ca' Foscari and managed by Venice International University-VIU (with the exception of the Erasmus International Credit Mobility programme) and the "Overseas" programme of international cultural exchanges outside the EU.
3. Contributions may also be available, subject to the availability of financial resources and according to the priority criterion set out in the following paragraph, for students who have not applied for the Scholarship, despite meeting the merit requirements for eligibility, due to the household financial situation exceeding the limits for the scholarship. In this case, students must submit the Benefits Application, they must meet the merit required outlined in art.8 and must not have a financial situation exceeding 40% of those foreseen by Article 7, paragraphs 13 and 14 of this call (I.S.E.E. of €36.828,75 and I.S.P.E. of €59.542,70).
4. The supplement shall be assigned, subject to availability of resources, to the students referred to in paragraphs 1 and 3 above, according to the following order of priority:
 - a) students who are eligible but non-beneficiaries in the academic year 2025/2026, based on their ranking position;
 - b) students awarded a scholarship in the academic year 2025/2026, based on their ranking position;
 - c) students who have not applied for a scholarship who, for the academic year 2025/2026, meet the requirements referred to in Article 8 above and the requirements relating to the financial situation not exceeding the values indicated in paragraph 3 of this article, in ascending order based on the I.S.E.E. certificate.

The assignees of the supplement described above shall be contacted by the Financial Aid Office.

5. It is an essential condition for the contribution, referred to in the preceding paragraphs, is that the period of study abroad must be recognised academically in terms of validation of credits in the study programme in which the student is enrolled at Ca' Foscari. Alternatively, at the end of the period abroad, students must produce a declaration by the thesis supervisor or tutor stating that during the study period abroad, they achieved the objectives set for the final test. Failure to meet this condition shall mean the contribution will be revoked and the amounts unduly paid must be returned.
6. The regional supplement for the students referred to in paragraph 1 will be €500,00 per month, and will be assigned for the duration of the period of stay abroad, up to a maximum of ten months. The amount of any grant awarded from European Union funds or from other bilateral agreements, including non-EU, shall be deducted from the total supplement awarded.
7. In addition to the supplement referred to in the previous paragraph, there will be regional refund of return travel costs up to €100,00 for European countries and up to €500,00 for non-European countries. The term "European countries" is understood to mean the countries of the European geographical area with the exclusion of Turkey and Russia.
8. The regional supplement for the students referred to in paragraph 3 will be €125,00 per month, and will be assigned for the duration of the period of stay abroad, up to a maximum of ten months.
9. Payment shall be made in two instalments. The first instalment of 40% of the total shall be paid by 30 June 2026 if Veneto Region gives the funding resources to the University on time; the final instalment of the residual amount and refund of return travel costs for the amounts foreseen in paragraph 7 of this article shall be paid within 50 days of the end of the mobility period, subject to achieving the results foreseen in the programme and presenting the relative supporting documents to the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it).
10. In case of failure to achieve the results required by the programme (*for example, failure to sit exams or complete educational activities agreed with the local exchange manager*), the initial instalment assigned to the student, referred to in the previous paragraph, must be returned by the same to the university within 30 days of notification by the Financial Aid Office.

Art. 13 - Foreign students

1. Non-EU students, under the same treatment as Italian students, shall access the services and measures for the right to education pursuant to Article 46, paragraph 5 of Presidential Decree no. 394 of 31 August 1999.

2. For the purposes of accessing the benefit, students who do not belong to the European Union are considered to be non-resident, regardless of the location of their residence in Italy and the location of their study programme, except in the case where their household resides in Italy. However, to be considered non-resident, students must pay for accommodation in the municipality of the university attended or in a municipality classified as local, for a period of at least ten months – five months in case of students who apply for the scholarship for the last semester, with reference to the academic year 2025/2026 (therefore between September 2025 and September 2026) and they must meet the conditions indicated in art.5, paragraph 2. If they do not meet those requirements, students shall be considered commuters.
3. The financial situation of foreign students or Italian students residing abroad shall be defined through the I.S.E.E. Equivalent, as indicated in the previous Article 7.
4. For students from particularly poor countries, including in relation to any low human development index, the list of which is established by Ministerial Decree 3 March 2025, no. 166, the assessment of the financial situation is carried out on the basis of certification by the Italian Representative in the country of origin confirming that the student does not belong to a family known to be high income and of high social standing.
Alternatively, in the case of students enrolled at a University in the country of origin, connected with agreements to the university of enrolment in Italy, this certification can be issued by the aforementioned university.
For students enrolling in the first year of Bachelor's degree and Master's degree programmes, certification that they do not belong to a family known to be high income and of high social standing can also be issued by Italian bodies authorized to provide a guarantee of financial coverage, as referred to in the current provisions on the enrolment of foreign students in Italian universities: in this case, the body issuing this certification undertakes to return the scholarship on behalf of the student in case of revocation, in accordance with the procedures set out in Article 11 of this text. Students are in any case obliged to declare any income and assets held in Italy by their household, according to the procedures indicated in the Article 7 above.
5. For the purpose of assessing the financial situation of students recognized as political, stateless refugees and holders of subsidiary and temporary protection status, only income and assets held in Italy are taken into account according to the procedures referred to in Article 7.

Art. 14 - Students with disabilities

1. For disabled students with a recognized handicap pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 of Italian Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 or with disability rate (recognized by the Italian National Health Commissions) of 66% or more, who are enrolled in Bachelor's/Master's degree programmes, the benefits referred to in Article 3 shall be awarded for:
 - a) 9 semesters for Bachelor's degree programmes;
 - b) 7 semesters for Master's degree programmes.
2. Disabled students:
 - a) are not subject to the provisions of art.10, paragraph 5, according to which payment of the second instalment of the scholarship is subject to achieving 20 CFU by 10 August 2026 (10 CFU for part-time students) and they are not subject to the provision of art.11, paragraph 1, according to which the scholarship is revoked to students who have not obtained 20 CFU (10 CFU for part-time students) by 30 November 2026;
 - b) are subject to the provisions of art.11 paragraphs 5 and 7. Therefore the scholarship shall be revoked for disabled students if they withdraw from their studies or transfer to another University for a.y.2025/2026 by 10 August 2026; moreover, their scholarship shall be revoked if they graduate in the extraordinary session of the academic year prior to the one for which they have been granted the scholarship.
3. The merit requirements for access to the benefit, which keep into consideration the criteria of art.8, paragraph 9, 10 and 11, are the following:

Bachelor's degree students

Students who use their bonus CFU partially in the academic year of their request can use the remaining part of the bonus in the following academic years.

5. Students with disabilities, with handicap recognised pursuant to Art. 3, paragraph 1, of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992, no. 104, or with a disability rate of at least 66%, are totally exempt from the tuition fees. Therefore, they do not need to pay the regional tax for the right to university education; the payment of the stamp duty is due only if they are enrolling for the first time in their study programme.

Art. 15 - Part-time students

1. Students assigned part-time status pursuant to the administrative provisions published on the website www.unive.it/part-time can apply for the benefits referred to in Article 3 as follows:
- for students enrolled in Bachelor's degree programmes, for a period of 7 years (fourteen semesters), starting from the first year of enrolment;
 - for students enrolled in Master's degree programmes, for a period of 5 years (ten semesters), starting from the first year of enrolment;

for students enrolled in the course attended with "full time" status and who, during their university career, have opted for "part-time" status, for the purpose of determining the number of years and the consequent merit requirement referred to in paragraph 6 below, each academic year attended with full-time status is counted as two "part-time" years.

2. The benefit is granted in the same way as indicated in Article 3 of this call.
3. The deadline for applying for scholarships is the same as that established in Article 4 above.
4. Part-time students must submit the scholarship application and must be enrolled at the University for the 2025/2026 academic year, according to the procedures indicated in the previous Article 4.

For part-time students, the Scholarship amounts equals to the 50% of the gross amount outlined in art.6 of this call. The amounts can be increased or reduced according to the provisions indicated in the aforementioned art.6. The amounts of the Scholarships, in accordance to the type of enrolment, the status and the values of I.S.E.E., are outlined in the following tables:

Scholarships shall be paid to eligible students entirely in cash and, if they use the catering service provided by the Venice ESU, they will be charged a rate of €5.70 per meal. Students with part-time status who are also

awarded the scholarship with non-resident status and winners of the ESU accommodation call are required to pay the rental fee directly to ESU Venezia.

Reductions shall not be applied to the total scholarships awarded to students enrolled in the seventh year of a Bachelor's degree course or in the fifth year of a Master's degree course.

5. Part-time students eligible and/or beneficiaries of the scholarship are exempt from paying the fees and contributions due for the 2025/2026 academic year (with the exception of those who enrolled at University through the "Formazione PA 110 e lode" project).
6. The merit requirements for access to the benefit for part-time students enrolled in the second year onwards of Bachelor's degree programmes and Master's degree, to be obtained by 10 August 2025, are as follows:

7. The bonus referred to in Article 8 above cannot be used to achieve this merit requirement. The count of the credits of the table above takes into consideration the criteria indicated on art.8, paragraph 10, 11 and 12.
8. The economic and financial conditions of the part-time student are identified with the same criteria as provided for in Article 7 above.
9. Students who, for the academic year 2025/2026, are enrolled in a bachelor's degree program (either newly enrolled or in a subsequent year) and wishes to switch from full-time to part-time status is encouraged to do so by 15 November 2025, in order to ensure the correct scholarship amount is assigned in case they are awarded the grant.
If the student acquires part-time status after the scholarship ranking has been processed, and they were originally awarded the scholarship as a full-time student, they will retain their position in the ranking, but the scholarship amount will be recalculated based on the tables in paragraph 4 of this article. The student will be notified by the Financial Aid Office.
10. A student who is awarded a scholarship as a part-time student for the academic year 2025/2026, but later loses that status by becoming a full-time student during the same year, will retain their position in the ranking and will keep the originally awarded scholarship amount.
11. For part-time students enrolled in the second year onwards, the second instalment of the scholarship shall be paid by 30 June 2026. The fees and contributions paid in the first instalment (with the exclusion of stamp duty) shall be refunded ex officio by 31 July 2026.
For part-time students enrolled for the first time, the second instalment of the scholarship shall be paid by 30 September 2026 if at least 10 credits have been earned by 10 August 2026. The fees and contributions paid in the first instalment shall be refunded ex officio by 31 July 2026.
12. Scholarships shall be revoked for students enrolled for the first time who, by 30 November 2026, fail to achieve at least 10 credits, attributed to the study programme in which the student is enrolled or alternatively to the study course in which they will enrol in the academic year 2026/2027, if different from the previous course.
The other reasons for revocation already mentioned in Article 11 also apply.

Art. 16 - Declarations: corrections and verifications

1. Benefit applications, accompanied by information on financial situation and merit, are presented by students with the right of self-certification pursuant to Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28 December 2000.
2. The University is obliged to check the truthfulness of self-certification presented by students by means of spot checks, which involve at least 20% of those eligible to benefit from special services and measures each year.
3. For the purpose of the checks on the self-certifications and documents presented by students (*ex. rental contract for confirming the non-resident student status*) the University may request documentary evidence of the

completeness and truthfulness of the information declared, including for the purpose of correcting material or minor errors.

4. The controls and checks on the truthfulness of student self-certification can also be performed after the benefit has been paid and with the help of the Italian finance police, to which the University sends the declarations for the relevant inspections. Direct checks may be carried out to verify the truthfulness of the information provided, performed by the Italian finance police with the banks and other financial intermediaries that manage personal assets, pursuant to Art.11, paragraph 6 of Prime Ministerial decree no. 159 of 5 December 2013; the university may also check the truthfulness of the declared household situation and perform comparisons of data on income and assets.
5. Should due administrative and tax checks reveal a declaration to be untrue, any benefit awarded shall be forfeited, even in the case of material or minor errors. This is without prejudice to the provisions of the national legislation in force. In particular, we refer to Articles 71 paragraph 1 bis, 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree no. 445/2000, the Criminal Code and Article 10, paragraph 3 of Legislative Decree no. 68/2012 which reads: *"Whoever [omissis] submits untruthful declarations [omissis] shall be subject to an administrative sanction consisting of the payment of a sum of three times the amount received, or the value of the services unduly used, and shall lose the right to receive other benefits for the duration of the study programme, without prejudice in any case to the application of the sanctions referred to in Article 38, paragraph 3 of Decree-Law no. 78 of 31 May 2010, converted, with amendments, by Law no. 122 of 30 July 2010, and in the penal legislation for criminal acts."*
6. **Students must notify the Financial Aid Office (dirittoallostudio@unive.it) promptly of any event occurring after the date of the submission of the application that is significant for the purpose of awarding the scholarship, of the status (non-resident, commuter, local) or of revoking the scholarship,**

Art. 17 - Head of the procedure

1. The person in charge of the procedure, pursuant to and in accordance with Law no. 241/1990, is the director of the Office for Student Careers and the Right to Education, Dr Micaela Scarpa.

Art. 18 – Information on the processing of personal data

Pursuant to Article 13 of EU Regulation 2016/679, known as the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), applicants to this selection process are informed that the processing of personal data, either provided by them or otherwise acquired by the University for this purpose, is carried out solely for the execution of the selection procedure. Processing will be done by authorized personnel at Ca' Foscari University of Venice, using manual and/or electronic means, in ways and within the limits necessary to achieve the above-stated purposes.

The data will be retained for 10 years in accordance with administrative record-keeping regulations and reporting requirements.

For the purposes outlined above, in addition to the University's employees and collaborators—who act based on specific instructions regarding the purposes and methods of processing—third parties who provide instrumental or ancillary services closely related to the University's institutional activities (such as external evaluators or staff at accommodation facilities) may also process personal data. An updated list of such parties is available on the University's website at: www.unive.it/pag/34666.

Providing this data is necessary to assess eligibility and qualifications. Failure to provide the data may prevent such assessment and result in exclusion from the selection procedure.

Rankings will be published in accordance with current regulations; no data will be disclosed to third parties unless required by judicial or regulatory authorities, or for activities related to the provision of benefits.

Applicants have the right to request from the University, in the cases provided for, access to their personal data, and the correction, deletion, or restriction of processing, or to object to processing (Articles 15 and following of the Regulation).
