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What is a double or joint degree programme?



Very international BA or MA programmes designed in cooperation with partner Universities all over the world



Students have the opportunity to spend part of their BA or MA at one or more partner Universities



At the end of the study path students receive either two diplomas (double degree) or only one diploma recognized by all partner Universities (joint degree)


Double - Joint Degrees are degree programmes that allow students to study at two universities and obtain two or more academic qualifications issued by partner universities.

The call for applications for Double - Joint Degree (DJD) programmes is published annually on this webpage and on the website of each degree programme as well. For most of the programmes, departures are planned for **next academic year**. Any exceptions are detailed in the Annex A of the call.


Final selection results will be published on the website of each degree programme within the webpage of the specific Double - Joint Degree.


Please note that the following Double - Joint Degree programmes are not managed through the call:

- <u>Careen Studies</u>, <u>Careen Studies</u>, <u>Careen Sustainable Development</u> and <u>Careen Studies</u>: the selection is managed by a consortium of partner Universities and interested students can submit their application on the dedicated portal;
- Italian Studies and Italian Studies and History of Art: the selection is managed by University College London (UCL). Interested students can submit their application on UCAS portal.



Language requirement for applying		Language requirement for application	English – level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. No official language certification is required.
		Admission requirements	 Acquisition of at least 24 CFU by the date of application. Obtaining 120 credits required for the first and second year by the last exam session before departure.



Selection procedure	Evaluation of academic qualifications by a Committee + interview (date and time of the interview will be communicated to candidates after the deadline for the submission of the application).

Publication date of the results	28/04/2023

Attachments to be uploaded

- Identity document (identity card or passport)*;
- CV in European format written in Italian*;
- Motivation Letter written in French*;
- Certificate or self-certification of French language*;
- For those who enroll in the 1st year in the A.Y. 2023/24: BA graduation certificate/self-certification with exams (or certificate of enrolment with exams for students who are about to graduate), only if the BA has not been awarded at Ca' Foscari;
- For those enrolled in the 1st year in the A.Y. 2022/23: any self-certification of the exams taken during the MA, only if they have not yet been registered in the online booklet.

Selection criteria

The Commission shall evaluate the applications received taking into account:

- experiences documented in the curriculum vitae;
 - Motivation letter;
- Interview;
- For students who enroll in the 1st year in the A.Y. 2023/24: graduation mark;
- For students enrolled in the 1st year in the A.Y. 2022/23: number of credits earned and weighted average of the exams taken.

The amount of mobility grants will be defined based on the applicant's **ISEE** (**Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator**).

Annex B of the call defines the monthly amount of the grant for each income range (from a minimum of 150€ to a maximum of 400€ per month) for mobilities taking place in 2023/24 a.y. only.

For mobilities taking place in 2024/25 or 2025/26, amounts will be announced as soon as they are defined (see art. 3.1 of the call)




Selections take place yearly and are managed by the Consortium leader (Université Pantheon- Sorbonne - Paris 1).

Double Degree with UCL University College of London






