Marie Skłodowska-Curie Individual Fellowships

Who can apply?

Experienced researchers: you should have obtained a doctoral degree, or at least four years of full-time equivalent research experience.

Types of grants

European Fellowships: spend 12-24 months at a European host institution (either in an EU Member State or Associated Country), in a country where you have not been for more than 12 months over the last 3 years.

Global Fellowships: spend 12-24 months at a partner organisation outside Europe, plus a mandatory 12-month return period at a European host institution like Ca' Foscari University. You should not have been in the partner organisation country for more than 12 months over the last 3 years.

Your topic

You will have the chance to **choose freely your research topic**, in collaboration with the scientific supervisor of the host organisation.

Financial support

The average salary of a Marie Curie fellow in Italy is around 4000 euros per month (after taxes). The fellowship budget include the following unit costs:
