HAVING REGARD the University Teaching Regulations

HAVING REGARD the Summer European Academy project organised in cooperation with Copenhagen Business School, Leuphana University of Lünenburg, Université Paris- Dauphine and University of St. Gallen and funded by German Haniel Foundation started in 2019

HAVING REGARD the proposal of Prof. Monica Calcagno to join the project of the Summer European Academy, seventh edition, whose theme Exploring Urban Atmospheres

CONFIRMED the School's interest in joining the initiative in light of the success of previous editions

HAVING REGARDS The Venice School of Management decree of the 19th February 2025.

WHEREAS

- that the University guarantees equal opportunities between men and women for access to the selection that is the subject of this notice;

Decrees

Article 1 – Announcement

Announcement of the call for selection of **5 (five) students** meeting the requirements set out in Article 3 below, for admission to the European Summer Academy entitled “**Exploring Urban**”

Atmospheres”organised and financed by the German Haniel Foundation of Duisburg in Germany (hereinafter referred to as the "Programme")

Art. 2 – Description

- 1.The Venice School of Management adheres to the European Summer project entitled "**Exploring Urban Atmospheres**" organised in cooperation with Copenhagen Business School, Leuphana University of Lünenburg, Université Paris-Dauphine and University of St. Gallen to be held in **Berlin from 23 to 28th May 2025**.
2. German Haniel Foundation promotes and finances the project and, if the lectures are held in Belino, the participating students will be accommodated at the organisation's expense and will receive a contribution towards their travel expenses-
3. Classes will be held in presence and the vehicular language of instruction will be English.
4. Participation in the Summer School may be recognised among the extra-credits (3ECTS) after evaluation of a final paper by Prof. Calcagno, from the Department of Management and reference lecturer for the European Summer Academy Summer School

Art. 3 - Admission requirements

Five (5) students enrolled in the first or second year of the Master's degree programmes activated by the Venice School of Management will be admitted to participate in the Programme.

Article 4 - Submission of Applications

1. To take part in the selection, the recipients referred to in Article 3 above must fill in the application form available on the following page:

The application must be accompanied by

- **a signed** curriculum vitae;
- **a motivational letter** in English on the Academy's subject matter;
- a valid identity document.

2. Applicants whose applications are found to be
 - a) received after the deadline
 - b) not drawn up on the online form
 - c) containing untrue statements

Art. 5 - Selection Committee and formation of the ranking list

1. The selection will be carried out by a committee composed of representatives of the Venice School of Management.
2. The academic career, the motivational letter and an interview aimed at assessing the candidate's personal aptitudes will be assessed.
3. The career will be assessed on the basis of the weighted average of grades.
4. The first **15** candidates from the list published starting from **12th March 2025** will be admitted to the interview.
5. For admission to the interview, the academic career and the motivational letter will be assessed.
5. The interview will be held in person in English on **19h March 2025 starting at 11.00 a.m.**
6. Each candidate's final score will be calculated as follows
 - a) 50% to the academic career and motivational letter (and, specifically, 20% of the score will be awarded to the academic career and 30% to the motivational letter)
 - (b) 50% at the interview.

In the event of a tie, preference will be given to the candidate who has acquired more CFUs.

Art. 6 - Publicising the results of the selection

The list of those admitted to the course will be published on the following webpage <https://www.unive.it/pag/47974/> under the heading European Summer Academy starting from **24th March 2025**.

2. Within 3 days from the date of publication of the ranking list, and in any case no later than **31st March 2025**, successful candidates accepted for the programme must send a declaration of acceptance of participation in the project by e-mail to international.management@unive.it.
3. In the event of withdrawal or non-communication by an admitted student, candidates will be called up and admitted according to the order established by the selection criteria. Notification of repechage will be made directly to the candidate by e-mail from the Didactic Secretariat of the Venice School of management.
4. The School reserves the right to contact other successful candidates on the ranking list should the number of places available for participation in the European Summer Academy increase.
