

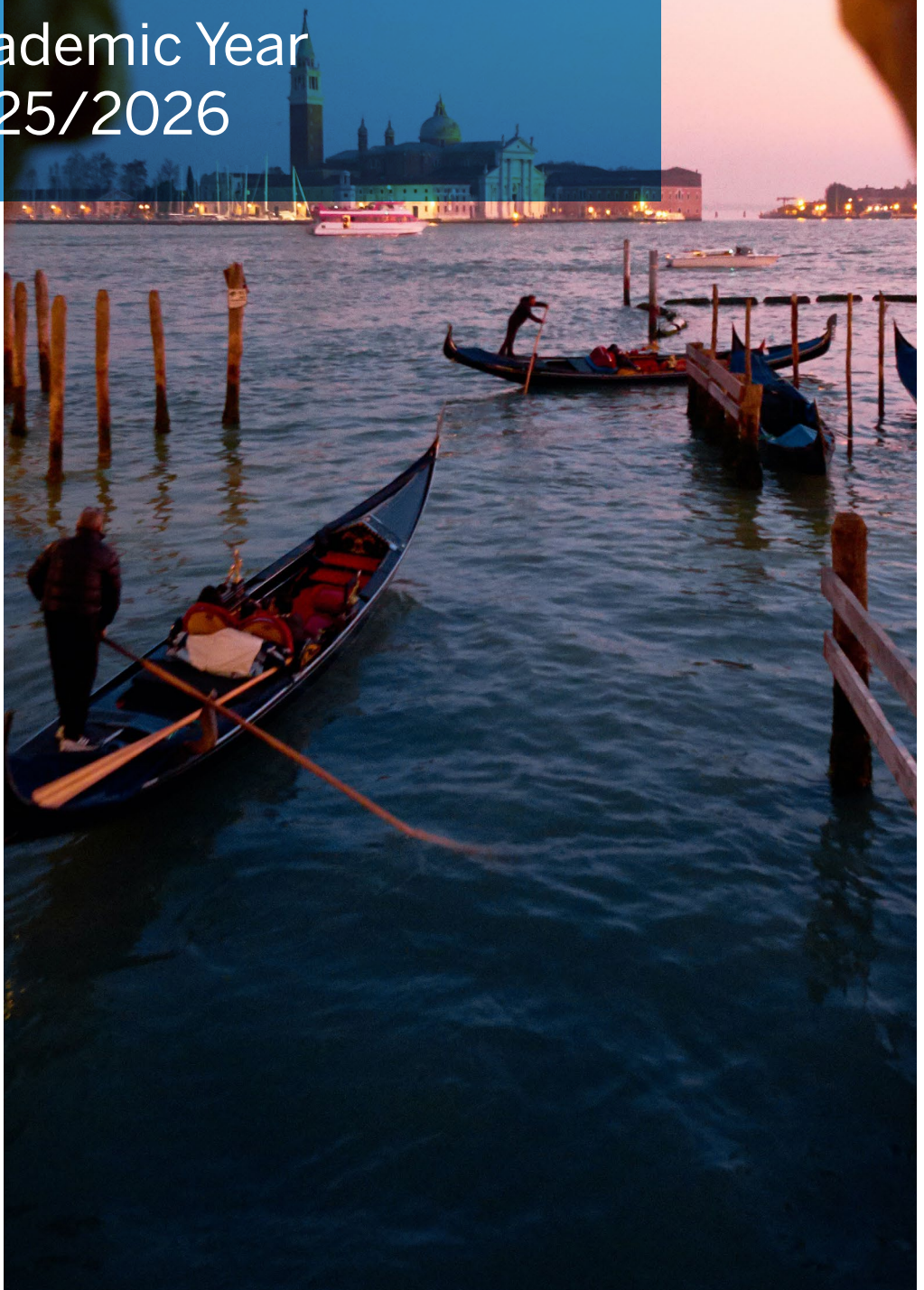

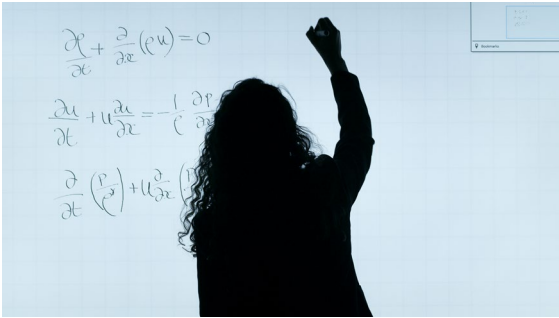

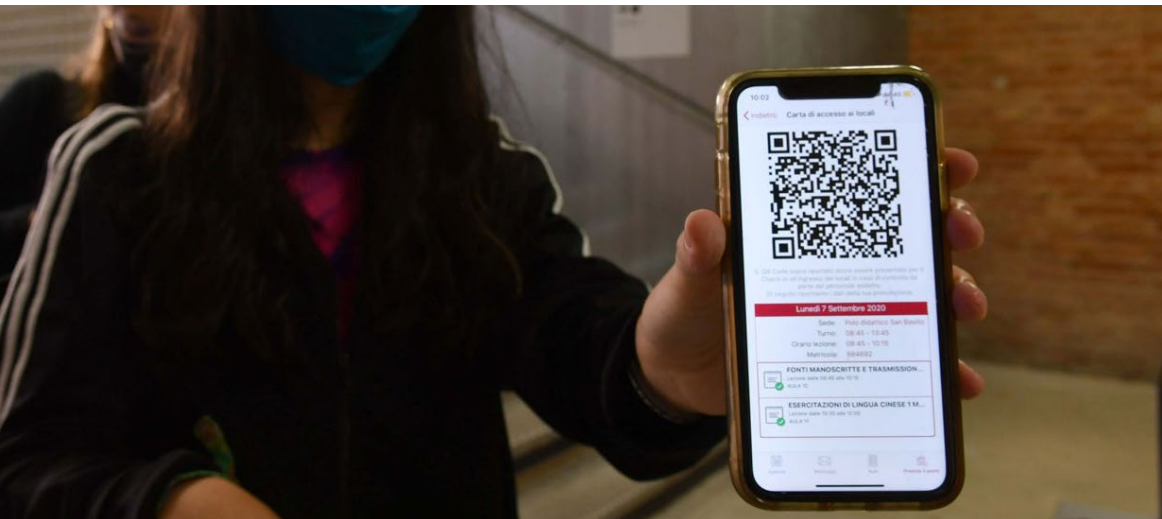

Studying at Ca' Foscari

Academic calendar

At Ca' Foscari the academic year starts in September. The courses in the scientific and humanistic areas are delivered in two semesters.

First semester: September–January

Exams: January/February

Second semester: February/March–June

Exams: June/July

Further academic sessions: late August – early September

The courses in the economics, management and humanities areas are delivered into four terms:

First term: September – October

First-term exams: November

Second term: November – December

Second term exams: January

Winter exam session: January/February

Third term: February – March

Third-term exams: March-April

Fourth term: April – May

Fourth term exams: May

Summer exam session: May/June

Further academic sessions: late August – early September

Grades and Study Plan

The Italian grading system works on a scale from 18 to 30. 18 is the lowest passing grade (sufficiency).

30 is the highest grade. In case of particularly outstanding exams, the professor can assign the so-called “lode” and the grade is registered as 30 cum laude (30L). Only if you pass the exam you will obtain the relevant credits (CFU - Crediti Formativi Universitari). Exams usually give 6 or 12 credits. The list of courses and educational activities in the academic course of study of a student form the so-called “Study Plan”. Every year students must complete their Study Plan online, in their Personal Area.

The two train stations of Venice are “Venezia Mestre” (in the mainland) and “Venezia Santa Lucia” (in the historical city centre).

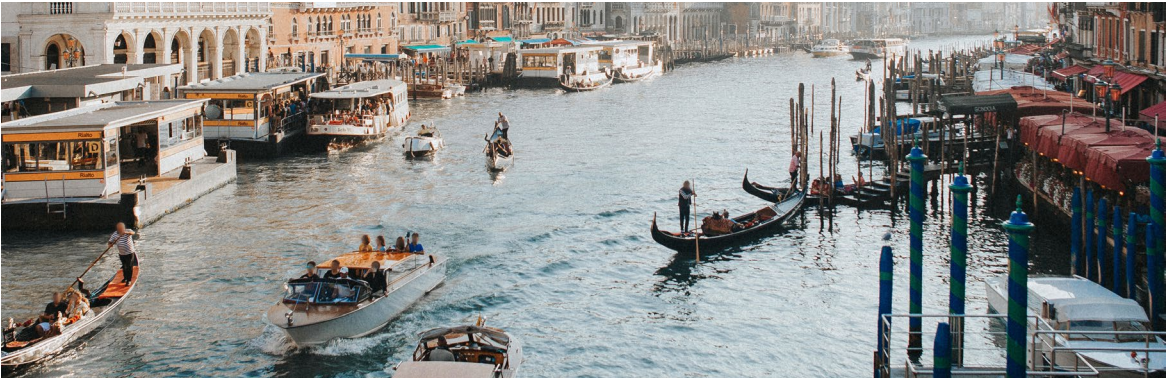

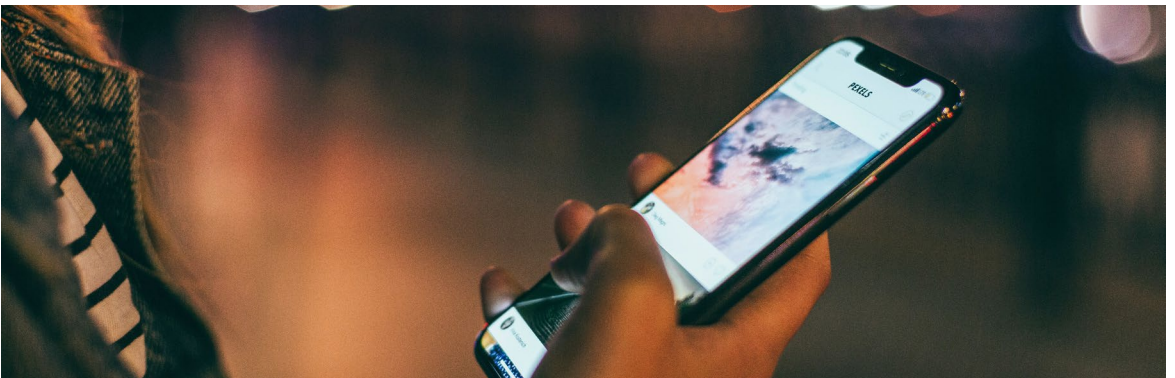

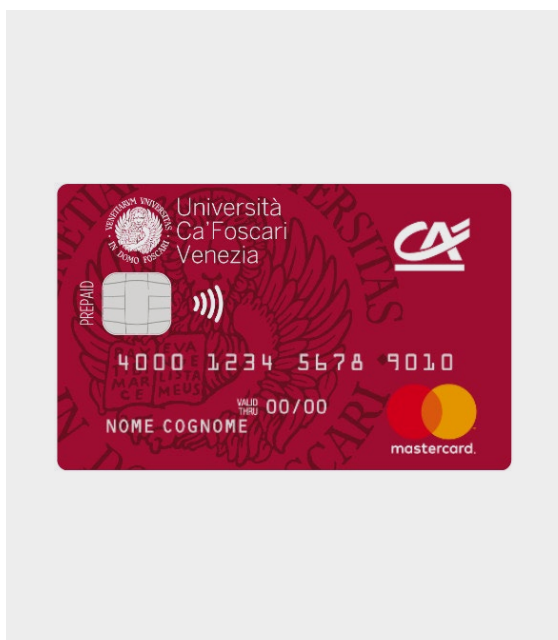
