Discussion Lab TIPS – Trust in Philosophy and Science

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Descrizione:

What is the value of pluralism in science? As the plurality of scientific approaches, methods, and standards becomes increasingly acknowledged, the question is no longer whether pluralism exists, but how it should be understood, managed, and valued. What does pluralism mean for the authority of science in liberal democracies? How can diverse forms of knowledge—including Indigenous and local epistemologies—be integrated without erasure? What challenges arise from the coexistence of multiple expertises, and how can pluralism contribute to both epistemic robustness and democratic legitimacy? Rather than opposing consensus, might pluralism be a condition for more inclusive and adaptable forms of agreement?

Articolazione:

Each of the 4 meetings will address an aspect of the relation between pluralism, science and society, which will be discussed on the basis of a relevant article – either assigned by the lab tutor or chosen by the students in the discussion group. Tasks and time commitment estimated for each meeting:

- Choosing reading material
- Reading the material
- Preparing for discussion (sometimes preparing presentation to lead the discussion)
- Taking part in online discussion (which might occasionally include guest participants)

Total amount of time estimated to prepare for each meeting: 14-15 hours

Blog space (<https://tipsunive.wordpress.com/>) **linked to the TIPS website** (<https://www.unive.it/web/en/7380/home>), run by the student group including one student coordinator

- The function of the blog is to collect questions, ideas and queries raised during the meetings in the form of short 'position papers' written by the students.
- The aim of the blog is to continue and extend the meetings' discussion in the context of an open forum, and particularly by addressing topics that students would find challenging and interesting to share with a wider audience.
- Besides written contributions, the blog intends to collect further material of interest, such as links to videos, images, statistics from reputable sources, etc.

Total amount of time estimated for each blog dealings: 2 hours for each eligible meeting.
