



INTERNSHIP AND FINAL EXAMINATION REGULATIONS

Bachelor's Degree Programme in Environmental Engineering for the Ecological Transition

Degree classification L-7 (R) - Civil and Environmental Engineering

Art. 1

Students who have earned at least 103 CFUs agree with a member of the University's academic staff (supervisor) on the topic of their final examination. The final examination entails drafting and presenting a written paper about the research conducted during the internship, which is an essential part of the programme.

Art. 2

Two types of internships are available:

- External internship: it is carried out at an institution, research laboratory or company outside the University (in this case, the University and the external company must have an agreement in force). External internship is regulated in accordance with the relevant legislation in force and the University's general provisions;
- On-Campus Training Activity (Attività Formativa in Campus, AFC): it is carried out in the laboratories of Ca' Foscari University of Venice. Here, the contact person is the university tutor, who is in charge of overseeing the activity performed.

Art. 3

To access the internship/On-Campus Training Activity (AFC), students must complete the Request form for final degree exam and submit it by email to the Scientific Campus Administration Office. The official thesis period starts on the date when the experimental work begins, which should be specified in the application.

Art.4

For each graduating student, the Teaching Committee of the Degree Programme designates a co-supervisor from the University's academic and research staff. The co-supervisor's role is to critically evaluate the work and collaborate with the supervisor to determine the final mark for the dissertation.

Art. 5

Students must submit the request to graduate in the session that they and their supervisor consider most appropriate. The procedures for admission to the graduation exam and for submitting the request to graduate are established by the University's governing bodies and described on the University's website.



Art. 6

The final exam is assessed in accordance with the criteria established by the University's governing bodies. The dissertation may be awarded a mark ranging from 0 to 6.

Art. 7

The conferment and awarding of diplomas will take place on the Graduation day. A Graduation day is scheduled in each graduation session, as per University decisions.

These Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Environmental Engineering for the Ecological Transition from the academic year 2023/2024 onwards.
