Steps to Hope

- Built between the 7-19th centuries
- 60-80 feet deep, rainwater seepage
- Water for communities, travelers
- Meritorious act by wealthy patrons
- Decline with advent of piped water
- Used as community halls

- Water values

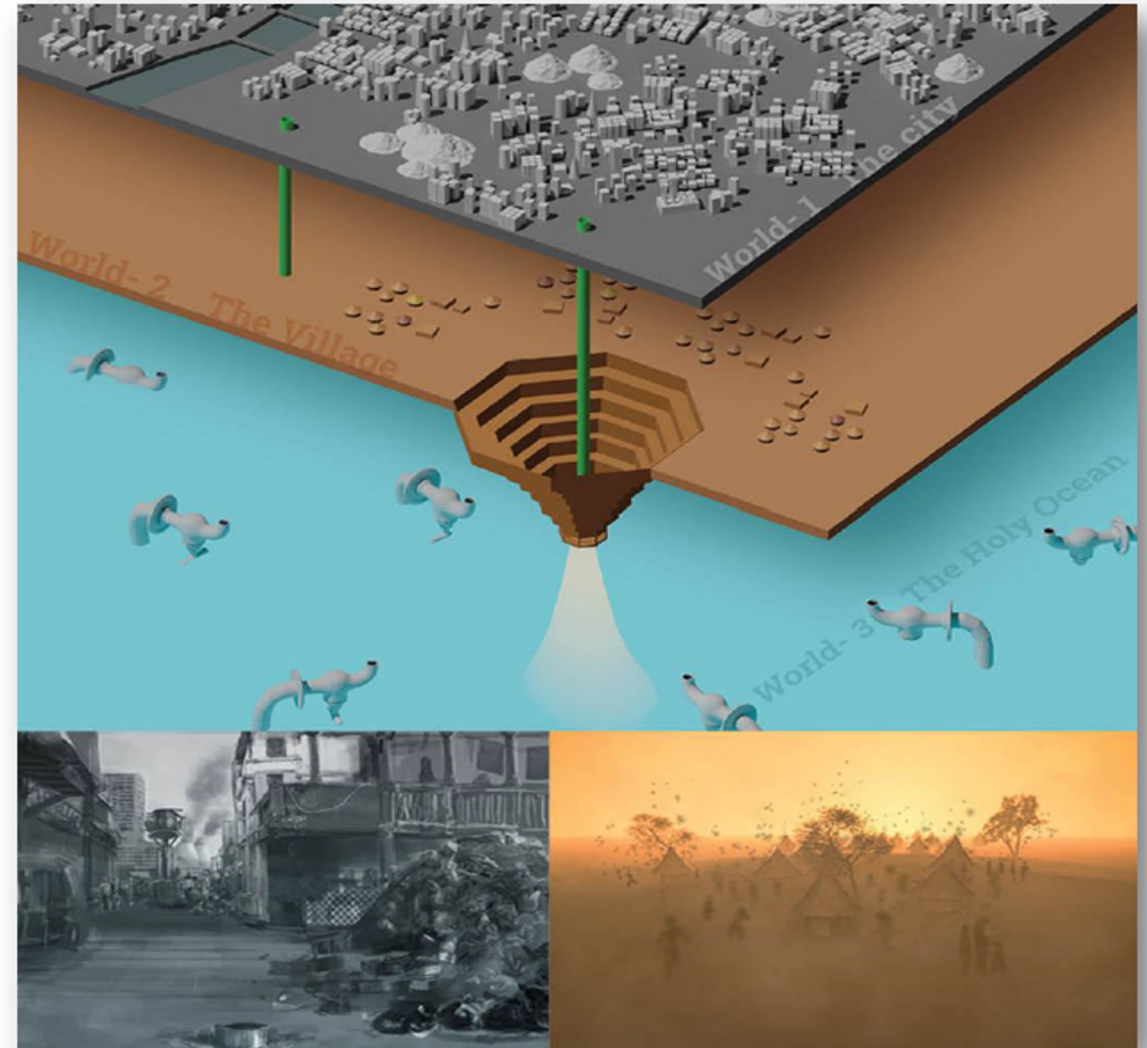
